Results

- The ICS Skills partner Multiplier Event was very well received;
- Attendees had not been aware of he project despite web site coverage and publication of the Country Report;
- Structured QA strateogies in EQOS were appreciated, like PDCA and the resources repository;
- Lesson pplanning tools and the Taxonomy wee of less interest;
- High level of interest in the course and certification, but information about access and funding were sought;
- EQAVET was a new concept to most of the teachers, but was welcomed with interest;
- There was a clear request that the course syllabus should reflect the particular requirements of the Irish Qualification and Quality Authority;
- Attendees agreed to be volunteers to help to customise the course once the final OpenQAsS version was produced.

Comments

On the whole, the project was welcomed as a contribution to the contstant struggle of improving the quality of education outputs and student experience. Many teachers rely on their own and their colleagues' professional approach to monitoring quality, but in an unstructured way, without tools and support services. The OpenQAsS approach of having a toolkit to assist this and a course and certification to prepare teachers was seen to be a great advance in the quality assurance of Vocational and Further Education and Training.
